

Blackford, Soon to be Winningest Coach in Section III

Our beloved Coach Tom Blackford is in the middle of coaching his 40th year of boys basketball and has now coached in five different decades. With all of these years under his belt he has some hefty accomplishments



to his name. He has an overall record of 571-285, 391-171 in 26 seasons at HCS and 180-114 in 14 seasons at Fayetteville-Manlius.

Blackford has amassed two Class D state titles, one in 1994 and the other in 2000. Our Emerald Knights under Blackford's leadership have won 13 league titles and five regional titles. They have traveled to the state final four on five occasions, including a runner-up finish in 2001. Coach Blackford has also been inducted into the New York State Basketball Hall of Fame in 2011, and just last year in 2021 Blackford was inducted into the Greater Utica Sports Hall of Fame. With this,

more than impressive resume, Blackford now sits just two wins away from becoming the winningest coach in Section 3. The current holder of the title is Pat Donelly, a former Bishop Ludden coach.

To conclude, I would like to congratulate Blackford for having such a long and successful career, and more importantly, as a member of the Basketball team I would like to thank him for being an amazing coach. The relationships he forms with his players, and the team atmosphere he finds a way to foster in the locker room, is like none other. Congrats Coach, you deserve it.

Dune Book Review



On October 22nd, 2021, the newest iteration of Frank Herbert's classic science fiction novel. Dune, premiered. The movie, starring Timothee Chalamet and Zendaya along with a cast full of high profile actors, received a multitude of awards. However, the movie was filled with intricate details references, which could lead to confusion if you are unfamiliar with the plotline. This was the situation I found myself in following my own attendance to *Dune*. Because of this, I decided to embark on Herbert's 800 page literary journey.

Dune, the novel, chronicles the adventures of Paul Atreides, the ducal heir to house Atreides. The story contains a classic battle of good versus evil, as Paul and his family are forced to fight for survival against their age-old rivals, the Harkonnens. This narrative begins with the Atreides being assigned to the planet Arrakkis, a desert world which is home to the universe's most important resource; spice. In spite of conflict and war being a common theme throughout the book, Dune also includes the development of religious and cultural themes which serve as the backbone for much of the plot. Similar to the Jedi order in Star Wars, the Bene Gesserit are an organization which serves protectors of the galaxy. Just as Anakin Skywalker is the 'chosen one' in the Star Wars saga, Paul Atreides fills a similar role in this story. However, instead of simply being powerful beyond measure,

Paul is instead blessed with the power of prescience. This term refers to the ability to see future events before they actually occur.

The summation of different storylines, such as Paul fulfilling the prophecy or his father fighting against Baron Harkonnen, makes for a story which can appeal to all audiences. This combination different premises leads to the book being a sort of Star Trek and Star hybrid by encompassing scientific elements in addition to glory and valor.

Erich Voigt, associate an professor in the Department of Otolaryngology noted "The body wants to immediately expel the garlic and its chemicals, so it's creating an overflow of mucus to flush out that irritant." He continued to note that the new crop of mucus was just adding to the collection of clotted phlegm that originally caused the congestion.

The snot of the TikTokers was merely a product of their own doing. "It's not the mucus that was trapped in there due to the disease or virus, it's the production of mucus meant to get the garlic out," Voigt said.



The professor also added how jamming garlic into one's nostrils can also cause skin irritation, chemical burns, bleeding, oral cavity burns, and severe sinus infections.

"If a small piece of gloves gets stuck in the nasal cavity, without the person even knowing it's in there, it could lead to a very bad nasal or sinus infection which could call for extraction through surgery" Voigt gives suggestions for less invasive ways to decongest your nose.

"Using a safe saltwater spray in the nose can wash out the mucus and steam inhalation through long, steamy showers, or personal steam inhaler can also be useful because the steam can thin the mucus."

Nonetheless, this viral trend has more than 94.9 million clips with one of the videos having a whopping 21.5 millions views.




Gym Class Hero: Joe Berry


